MATS FOR THE HOMELESS PROJECT



People of all ages work together to make sleeping mats.

The making of the mats out of used plastic shopping bags, is not hard, but does require investment of time and busy hands. The bags are prepared by cutting strips and joining the strips and rolling them into balls called "PLARN" (PLastic yARN). The Plarn is then crocheted or woven into mats.

If you would like to help, we still need clean plastic shopping bags, which you may drop off at the church. You may also like to attend

one of the "Plarn Workshops" scheduled on the church calendar (Bring your own scissors, please). Plarn Workshops are held most Monday nights at 6:30 in Boka Keene. (Will not meet on Memorial Day) We plan to meet all four Mondays in June, as well as Wednesday, June 6 at noon.

"Planting a church can make a huge and lasting impression in the community it serves," says Terrell L. McTyer, minister of New Church Strategies and church planter. "By empowering the oppressed, praying for the disenfranchised, caring for the poor and promoting hope in a fragmented world, the church can literally help change the world," he adds.

Each year, half of the Pentecost Offering is designated to the local Christian Disciples Region/Area in an effort to start and sustain new churches. The other half is used by Hope Partnership to support the recruitment, assessment, training and coaching of new church leaders at events like Leadership Academy.

"DID YOU KNOW?" - FROM THE VISION TASK FORCE

The senior minister's salary has not increased since she was hired in September 2015. When our health insurance provider changed a year and a half ago, the premiums went up. The senior minister contract includes the church covering health insurance and Jenny's monthly check was increased to cover the additional insurance cost. Jenny pays the health insurance company directly.

The last pay raise other SHCC staff had was a small one in 2016.

Leadership Council approved new office hours that will go into effect on June 1: 9:00-3:00 Monday through Thursday.

We now have a different postage meter which will save

SHCC around \$150-\$200 per year.

A new janitorial service is under contract and begins June 1. The new service will save \$4,000 each year. Jill Hill will serve as Interim Family Life (Children and Youth) Director this summer as a search committee looks for a new director.

UPDATE FROM THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

During the past 6 weeks, the Stewardship Committee has been planning for SHCC's future bookkeeping and record keeping needs. With Suellen Caywood's departure goes the knowledge and expertise that we have been fortunate enough to have for the past 29 years. Merely trying to replace Suellen would be a futile effort.

The committee has put requests out to outside financial organizations to find the right

fit for our accounting needs.

We received 3 bids for the position. One organization stood out to us as having the experience and knowledge to take on our accounting needs. The opportunity has been awarded to the offices of Kathryn J. Green, CPA. The firm is located in Midwest City.

Payroll will be the first and most important setup as we transition into this outside accounting service.

Please understand that this is a big transition, and there may be a few bumps along the way, but we are confident that this is one of many important steps that SHCC will be taking to appropriately update our business model.

COMMUNITY AND OUTREACH

CAMINANTE REPORT

I recently had the good fortune of participating in a trip to learn about the Caminante program in the Dominican Republic. Caminante, initiated by a Catholic nun—Sister Denisse—in the 1900's, serves children in the Boca Chica area who often worked the beaches selling trinkets and candy to the tourists which made them vulnerable to prostitution and drug trafficking.



Children attend the government school 4 hours a day, either morning or afternoon. Sister Denisse began establishing "homework rooms" for these children in their off-school time. College educated teachers, psychologists, and social workers serve over 300 children annually in these homework rooms.

Our group visited all 5 of the current homerooms, helped 350 children make God's Eye ornaments and learned how to make coconut jewelry with the students.

Sister Denisse also created a vocational school supported by local businesses and former recipients of Caminante's programs. Skills which lead to good paying jobs are taught: sewing, cooking, baking, computer technology, pharmacy tech, cosmetology, plumbing, electricity and others as they are needed.



The Oklahoma Disciples of Christ churches support this program with annual contributions. It is a worthwhile cause. If you are inclined to give, designate your check to Christian Church in Oklahoma --Caminante, 301 NW 36th St., OKC, OK 73118.

Contributions help provide supplies for the homerooms (about \$10/person per year), and supplies for a summer community fair program that will serve over 800 children (patterned after a vacation Bible School).

FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY

Georgia Shaw is spearheading a new program at SHCC to provide weekend breakfasts to the food insecure population of Edmond. Such a program would supplement the Breakfast on Boulevard program of FCC Edmond, which provides weekday meals. As part of the process, she is researching the need for food assistance for people in Edmond, and sharing that information with our congregation. The results of Georgia's research will be published here through a series of Sharing Tree articles. The HOPE Center, (Help Our People in Emergencies) The Edmond HOPE Center, located at 1251 N. Broadway has been providing assistance to members of the Edmond community since 1984. The center was developed by the Edmond Ministerial Alliance, volunteers and a grant from the Edmond Women's Club. They have grown through the years in services, budget, facilities, volunteers and the number of people they have helped.

The HOPE Center provides food, clothing, rent and utility assistance and a prenatal clinic to Edmond residents. In 2017 they gave 650,000 pounds of food to 4,102 families. Clothing and household items were given to 8,405 people and \$325,000 was paid out to help with rent and utilities. Their prenatal clinic had 17 healthy births.

How are they funded

HOPEfully yours, their resale store on N. Broadway, provided the biggest source of income, \$510,000 in 2015. That year they also received \$332,000 in contributions and grants, \$251,000 in Federal awards, \$192,000 in City of Edmond grants and \$228,000 worth of food, clothing and household goods donated by the public. The samaritan fund drive sponsored by the Edmond Sun in December is their only fund raiser.

In 2017, Southern Hills gave The HOPE Center .0090% of its outreach monies, or \$3,901.46. We also have a food drive for the agency each July. Many of our members and groups "adopt" a family at Christmas. Toys and clothes are bought and wrapped for the whole family.

How much they spend

Their 2015 budget report shows that they spent \$860,000 on food, clothing, utility and rent assistance that year. Other expenses for 2015 was \$254,000 for their Women's, Infants and Children's Programs and \$28,000 for their Clinic programs. They spend very little for administrative costs and use 200 volunteers a week to do most of the work. Many Southern Hills Christian Church members have volunteered at the HOPE Center through the years.
