WHAT IS STEPHEN MINISTRY?

Stephen Ministry is needed more now than ever before. You ask "What is Stephen Ministry?" Well, here is an explanation. As more people experience greater stress and turmoil in life, congregations have a unique opportunity to reach out with Christ's care. Stephen Ministry empowers congregations to meet people's emotional and spiritual needs in an extremely effective way - through well-trained lay caregivers called Stephens Ministers.

Stephen Ministers is a non-profit Christian training organization based in St.Louis. Since 1975 S.M. has provided high-quality, Christ centered training and resources to more than 11,000 congregations from more than 150 denominations. In addition to caring evangelism, SM offers resources in lay caring ministry, spiritual gifts discovery, grief support, church leadership, spiritual growth and more. They are located in all 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces, and 24 other countries.

You ask "Why is it called the Stephen series?" Stephen was one of the first laypeople commissioned by the Apostles to provide a caring ministry (Acts 6). Stephens Leaders are pastors and lay leaders who direct Stephen Ministry in their congregation. Stephen Ministers are laypeople who receive Christian care giving training in their congregation and then provide one-on-one, Christ-centered care to hurting people. Each Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with

that person once a week. This care is provided to individuals facing a variety of crises or life challenges - people who are experiencing grief, divorce, cancer, financial difficulties, hospitalization, chronic illness, disabilities, loneliness, a spiritual crises, or other life struggles. We are also available to non-members reaching out to un-churched people in crisis.

Pastors tell us that Stephen Ministry deepens and expands the caring capacity of their congregations. This frees pastors to invest more time in other important ministry areas. All relationships are kept strictly confidential. Over half a million people have trained and served since 1975.

Our logo symbolizes that we are all broken people and that we are only made whole through the cross of Jesus.

May God bless you and we pray that we can bring Christ's love and care to more and more hurting people.

We wish to include those who have cared for a loved one now deceased; those caring for the elderly; those caring for a loved one with special needs; or any other care needs.

Our next gathering will be at 7 pm, August 21. We hope you will join us. There are no requirements for attendance. Come by and check out the group. If the days and times need to be changed, we will do that. This is for you.

SHCC FREE BREAKFAST PROGRAM

GUIDELINES

Breakfast will be served to anyone who comes on Saturdays from 7:30 am until 8:15 am beginning September 1, 2018. Our visitors do not have to meet any criteria to have a meal here. Church members who would like to come for breakfast are also welcome. There is no charge for the meal, but donations are welcome. Envelopes will be on tables for that purpose.

The door from the S. W. parking lot, off Clay Drive, will be opened at 7:30a.m. Breakfast service will stop at 8:15. A hot meal plus choice of coffee, water, juice or milk will be served for breakfast. If visitors want something else, a self service choice of cold cereal, milk and fruit will be available. Two sandwiches will be given to each visitor when they leave, if desired.

Some reminders for our visitors

Backpacks and large personal items will be left in the hallway outside fellowship hall. These items will be kept

secure by the Greeters.

Visitors may not enter the kitchen area.

We are not able to send "take out" breakfasts or leftovers with our visitors at this time.

There is no smoking allowed anywhere in the Church.

If the local news recommends that we stay off the roads because of severe winter weather, the breakfast will not open that day.

The Saturday breakfast will not be open on major holidays.

Pets must be left outside. A water bowl will be outside and a meal of dry dog food will be given to pet owners for their animals as they leave the breakfast.

A WORD ABOUT SECURITY

Unfortunately we have to be aware of security issues every day, wherever we are, even at Church. We are inviting the poor, the lonely and the homeless into our Church for food. Like any group of people from the general public, some of these visitors could have drug/alcohol problems, mental health issues or criminal backgrounds.

Southern Hills does have insurance that will cover these visitors who are here for breakfast just as it covers visitors who come for worship.

The entire breakfast program will be confined to the west end of the building, including the kitchen and the fellowship hall.

There are security cameras on the north door near the kitchen that volunteers will be using and the south door that our visitors will be using. There are also security cameras in the fellowship hall.

Here are some guidelines to follow to help keep ourselves and our visitors from becoming victims.

Volunteer's cars should be parked on the north side of the fellowship hall and volunteers will enter the building through the north door off Myra Drive. We will let each other in and that door will be kept locked. Cars should be left locked with nothing tempting left inside.

Volunteer's purses will be locked in the conference room across from the kitchen before the work begins. Keys and

cellphones could be stowed in a pocket or a fanny pack. Do not leave your belongings in your car. Edmond has experienced some car break-ins and purse thefts.

The south entry doors (the doors that lead to the big parking lot off Clay) will not be opened for the breakfast until 7:30 and not then unless there are at least 3 volunteers present. By 7:30 we should have six volunteers present. Doors to the conference room, the parlor and the hall leading to the Sunday school rooms will remain locked. Both the north and the south kitchen doors will remain locked. When the breakfast is over, at 8:15, the south doors leading to the parking lot will be locked.

Anyone who is verbally or physically abusive to anyone will be firmly asked to stop and to leave the building immediately. 911 will be called for Edmond Police assistance. The incident will be documented on an incident report form and turned into the Church office. Remember, a kind word will often decelerate an angry situation.

Anyone who experiences an injury or medical emergency will be given basic first aid as needed and 911 will be called for EMSA assistance if necessary. A first aid kit is available in the kitchen. All incidents will be documented on an incident report and turned into the Church office.

Edmond Police will be notified of our meal program prior to it's start date.

SHCC FREE BREAKFAST PROGRAM

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS

The free breakfast program is completely dependent upon volunteer service. Volunteers can be from the SHCC congregation and/or the Edmond community. Teens may volunteer, but younger children must be accompanied by one or both parents. This would be a great "family service" opportunity. We will have sign up sheets available for volunteering beginning August 12 in the gathering area.

There are many ways to volunteer and help this program such as shopping, making sandwiches and cookies, greeting visitors, cooking, serving and clean up.

Volunteers will be served breakfast at 8:15 after our visitors have left.

The volunteer duties are:

Shoppers will purchase food on Friday before the Saturday meal and have the supplies in the Church kitchen by 1:00 p.m. They may use the Church's Sam's Club card. Receipts must be marked SHCC FREE BREAKFAST, dated, signed and put in the drop box near the office in order to be reimbursed.

Cooks will cook the food and do some advance preparation the day before. They will need to arrive at the Church at 2:00 p.m on Fridays and make sure they have everything they will need to prepare the next days meal based on the menu for that day. This includes the food, condiments, mixing bowls, pans, utensils, etc. Any food that can be prepared in advance such as cooking of sausage patties or putting together breakfast casseroles will be done on Friday, refrigerated and cooked or reheated on Saturday. Tables will be set with cloths, placemats and silverware on Friday. Cooks will prepare the meals on Saturday and plate them for the servers. Cooks should arrive at 6:30 a.m. on Saturday. I think we need to have two cooks at all times.

Sandwich makers - A choice of meat and cheese sandwich or a peanut butter and jelly sandwich will be prepared for each person to take with them if they want it. Condiments, an apple and 2 cookies will also be put in the sacks. Sandwiches will be made in advance and frozen, then sacked up that morning. This could be done any day of the week depending on the volunteer's schedule.

Cookie bakers will bake cookies, store them is baggies and freeze them. This could be done any day of the week, depending on the volunteers. The sandwiches and cookies could be done on the same day.

Greeters - Two greeters will receive and welcome all visitors as they come in and show them into the dining area (fellowship hall). The Greeters will stay near the south entry door and make sure that any backpacks or large items brought in by the visitors remain secure. The greeters may be the first contact our visitors have with Southern Hills as they enter and the last person they see as they leave. We want them to leave with a pleasant friendly impression of Southern Hills Christian Church. Greeters should arrive at 7:15 a.m.

Servers will stay in the Fellowship Hall near the kitchen door and as they see a visitor seated, they will get him/her their beverage, then get them a plate of food. They will monitor the cereal, milk and fruit supply, serve extra beverages and ask the visitors to take their dishes and silver ware to the dish room window when they are finished. They will offer the sack lunches to the visitors. If there are more visitors than we have places set up for, they will wipe off the tables and place additional set ups on the table as soon as a space is available. I would like to have at least two Servers present at all times. Servers should arrive by 7:15 a.m.

Clean up - All volunteers will pitch in and help clean up after they have their breakfast. That way everyone should be ready to leave the Church
