

# MATS FOR THE HOMELESS SERVICE PROJECT

Southern Hills volunteers (and others from the community) have provided plastic sleeping mats for homeless persons in our area, made from repurposed plastic bags. We create mats that protect our friends from the cold or moisture, and provide a measure of comfort. Once completed, the mats are taken to our sister congregation, Refuge Fellowship, in downtown Oklahoma City, and given to those who sleep outside. Pastor Noel Gray distributes the mats. Join us if you are interested in helping in any way with this project.

#### HOW YOU CAN HELP WITH SLEEPING MATS FOR THE HOMELESS:

- 1. Collect: Bring clean used plastic shopping bags to the church. We can use bags, such as Walmart, Target, Dollar General, Sprouts any color. We can use larger bags from retail stores if they are not too heavy. We cannot use lightweight (such as produce bags), or torn bags.
- 2. Sort and smooth: Sort through the bags donated, eliminate those not suitable. Smooth bags to be ready for cutting.
- 3. Cut: Use a rotary cutter and cutting mat (provided), or use scissors, to cut bags into strips.
- 4. Join: Join strips that have been cut, forming balls of PLARN.
- 5. Crochet: Crochet mats, either at home or with our group at church.

Instruction is provided for all steps. You can do the steps on your own or with a group. All the steps are important and needed. Plarning workshops are held most Mondays at 6:00 p.m. and occasionally at other times. Contact Beth Gerardy (405) 824-2543.

# **INTRO TO YIN JI JING & ZY QIGONG**

#### ABOUT THE TEACHERS:

**Claire GuYu Johnson** grew up in Beijing and in the US in a family of tai chi, herbal medicine, acupuncture and qigong practitioners. She met and studied with a number of masters including ZY Qigong Grandmaster

Xu Mingtang who traveled with in 1999 internationally. She has practiced solitary meditations without food and water in Chinese and Tibetan caves. In 2000 she established America's first ZY Qigong School and Healing Center in Seattle.

**Jerigtu Borjigin** is a Mongolian healer from the land where Shamanism originated and a family of well-known Shamans, healers and Tibetan Buddhist Rinpoches. He is the sole successor of a rare Taoist lineage of Yi Jin Jing. He apprenticed with Taoist healers and ZY Qigong Grandmaster Xu Mingtang. Claire and Jerigtu met in Inner Mongolia and married in 2010. They teach and heal internationally.
