

A WORD FROM OUR INTERIM MINISTER

It seems that anniversaries or other markers in our lives serve to cajole us into taking inventory of our lives, and hopefully give thanks. Our faith teaches us that we should begin each day with a world of praise on our lips, but sometimes we forget. So thanks be to God for those markers. There surely is a lot to give thanks for at Southern Hills Christian Church.

Thanks be to God for Southern Hills Christian Church: for our administrative staff, our building maintenance team, for our programming staff, and for our wonderfully gifted worship leadership team (we would be amiss if we didn't sneak in yet another word of thanksgiving, and "Welcome to the world," to the newly arrived, every precious breath of life, Harper). Another reason to give thanks is the people of this church. We have volunteers coming and going at all hours of the day here: picking up in the sanctuary, making sure the coffee will be ready, preparing cocoa for Christmas Eve & a Chili cook-off for our Epiphany party. We have volunteers that give countless hours to taking care of financial matters, outreach priorities and worship preparations. We have volunteers that serve as bridge pastors & serve at a moment's notice when the pastor gets bitten by the stomach bug. We have volunteers that sit with folks who are not feeling well, or simply feel alone. We have volunteers, who come in and water the plants, pick up ' the junk,' and who take the time to make our church look and feel warm and welcome. We have more volunteers than is possible to list. Over the last month, as I worked relatively long hours, it never ceased to amaze me, who would pop up in the building at the strangest time, to take care of a necessary, often simple but easily overlooked task. In his recent book, The Great Spiritual Migration, Brian McLaren writes:

"What would it mean for Christians to rediscover their faith not as a problematic system of beliefs, but as a just and generous way of life, rooted in contemplation and expressed in compassion, that makes amends for its mistakes and is dedicated to beloved community for all."

SHCC understands this at least in part but what would it mean for our church to rediscover our faith in such a way? I would argue this church is by and large made up of people committed to "just and generous" ways of life. We are compassionate people, and many of us are engaged in contemplative spiritual disciplines, often as simple as prayer. Which begs the question: how are we sharing this Good News? It doesn't have to be difficult. In fact, I think it comes rather naturally for most of us (if we don't over think it or get in the way of ourselves). In the meantime, as we continue into this new year, let's try to begin each day with a word of thanksgiving on our lips: "Oh God, thank you for our lives." Or, "Gracious Creator, thank you for the people you have put in my life." Or, "God thank you for my life, please help me serve." The list goes on, and you don't need me to tell you how to pray. Hopefully, however, you take my point: it is important to begin each day with a word of gratitude and praise on our lips, so we can remember who we are, to whom we belong and the world which we are called to serve.
