ORDINARY PEOPLE - EXTRAORDINARY LIVES

#thestoriesofjesus

Beginning February 6th at 7 p.m., Southern Hills Christian Church will take our first steps into the wilderness of Lent as we observe Ash Wednesday. Receiving the sign of ashes on our forehead we will hear these words: "From Ashes We Come To Ashes We Return, Repent and Live the Gospel." Ideally we pray to God daily, as Psalm 90 instructs, to help us number each day we live, that we may have a wise heart. Or to put in our common vernacular, as my grandmother would often tell me, "Nobody's tomorrow is guaranteed." Pure and simple, life is a gift. During the season of Lent, we are asked to use approximately 6 weeks (some like to say 40 days) preparing for Easter.

This year as we explore what it means to prepare for Easter, our theme for worship, as well as the Fun and Fellowship activities, will be: Ordinary People – Extraordinary Lives #thestoriesofjesus. Jesus was telling stories all the time. They most generally involved ordinary people living extraordinary lives. Jesus used these stories to discuss what the Kingdom of God is like. An example, from a recent Sunday morning scripture reading, found in Matthew 13 is: Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened."

There is a great deal to unpack in that one sentence. Jesus was as shrewd as he was wise. A part of our call as followers of The Ways of Jesus, is to contemplate what ushering in the kindom of God means; once we figure that out, ours is that call to work to make it happen. It may be different for each of us. What Jesus tells us, and what we will be exploring this Lenten season, is that God uses ordinary people who live extraordinarily (if only for a moment; if only for a day; if only for a lifetime) to usher in the kindom of God. #thestoriesofjesus tell us that God wants to use our seemingly ordinary selves, to live extraordinary lives.

Most of us think that we live simple, ordinary lives. Jesus teaches us that the Kindom of God is like... ordinary people, making extraordinary choices. As followers of the ways of Jesus, we don't see the world the same; nor do we see it like many of our neighbors. Jesus calls us to search out God's vision for our world; and to make it a part of our own. To do that, we need to have our eyes, ears, and hearts open! God needs each of us to help prepare the way for a world where the risen Jesus defends the vulnerable, defeats despair, and defies death.


ONE SERVICE - SUNDAY, MARCH 10

Special Lenten Series: A Swing Through Church History and Disciples 101

Ever wondered how the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) started? Ever wonder why "Disciples of Christ" is always in parentheses? Curious about the Church Jesus came to establish and how it evolved after his death? Ever wondered what the Reformation or the Restoration were all about? Then we have a class for you! During five Sundays in Lent (March 10th through April 7th) we will have a special class during the Sunday School hour focused on the following topics:



Sunday March 10th: Foundations of Faith, from Jesus up to the Reformation

Sunday March 17th: The Reformation Period

Sunday March 24th: The Restoration Movement and beginnings of the DOC, the 1800s

Sunday March 31st: The formation of a denomination, 1900s through today

Sunday April 7th: Women in Disciples History (in Fellowship Hall)

This class is for anyone interested in church history, but especially for new members who have never been through an introductory Disciples class, or anyone who is thinking about becoming a member of Southern Hills. The first four classes will be taught by Lisa Wynn (and held in the chapel), and the final class will be a special presentation on Women in Disciples History, taught by Professor Lisa Barnett, PhD, from Phillips Seminary (and held in Fellowship Hall). All ages (including youth) are welcome.
