**Pray-ground.** You may have seen (or heard) the expanded pray-ground in our sanctuary. Just as Jesus welcomed the children, we want to make sure our children know they're an important part of the body of Christ, even as they're learning how to be in worship. Even though it is designed as a quiet space, it will take some time to get used to the sounds the Pray-ground inevitably invites. These are the sounds of children learning, and they are the important reminder that learning to be in worship is a lifelong journey; a journey that can only happen through practice.

### PLARN? WHAT'S THAT?

Are you curious about the Plarn Workshop on the church calendar each week? Do you have questions about why we are collecting Plastic shopping bags? Do you wonder who gets the "Mats for Homeless" we make? Would you like to see how the mats are made?

On Sunday, April 28, in connection with Earth Sunday, we are going to have a demonstration in Fellowship Hall during the Sunday School hour, of what we do, and show you how you can help.

The Plarning Project is a service project that combines:

- 1. care of the earth through repurposing plastic bags
- 2. care of the human family who are homeless.







## AN UPDATE ON THE WEEKEND BREAKFAST

Since September 1, 2018, we have served 513 visitors breakfast and given them food for the rest of their day. This service could not have happened without many donations from the congregation and the work of over 100 different people who have volunteered many hours. I have estimated the total volunteer hours for 2018 to be 827.

We have recently received a \$1,000 grant from the Oklahoma Disciples Foundation. Plans are to buy a commercial style refrigerator and freezer for the Church kitchen and have the electrical work done to support these appliances. The breakfast committee has decided to start getting estimates on the electrical work. As the freezer is an immediate need we will plan some fund raisers, and save up the money until we have the \$2100 needed. Donations of any size towards this project will be welcomed.

We have financed the breakfast so far with donations, fundraisers and .002 percent annually from Outreach funds. We spend money every week for groceries and supplies for the kitchen Our weekend breakfast fund is about \$4,200 at this time, not counting the grant money and not counting a gift of \$250.00 that was given for the freezer.

We plan to sell TLC gift cards beginning in April, sell food at the Folksongs and Fellowship concert in May and have an indoor garage sale in the fellowship hall August 9th and 10th.

We would like to expand the program to include Sundays early in 2020. Yes, it will take more money, more volunteers, more everything, but hungry people will be fed, even on the weekends.


- Disciples Women leading Bible studies, international journeys, and providing educational materials, to support and empower Disciples women everywhere.
