GOD'S GRACE IS SUFFICIENT

How would you rate your faith? Is it up one day and down the next? In the book of James we read practical advise for those of us whose faith fluctuates because of difficult circumstances. When we start doubting God and His Word, we're driven and tossed around like a small boat on a stormy sea.

James tells us that a double-minded man is unstable in all his ways and should not expect to receive anything from our Lord. To be double-minded is to go back and forth in our thinking. We may begin with strong confidence in God, but as time goes by and difficult situations present themselves and continue, we may start to doubt what the Lord will do and what He has promised.

Doubting and questioning are two different things. Questioning is seeking to gain further information in order to better understand what God has said. Doubting on the other hand, involves believing in what we think, see, or feel rather than what we know He has said.

It is only a natural thing for us to question when we are



suddenly overcome by distressing situations. God does understand our struggle and wants us to come to Him with our pain and confusion. There are times when He has to sift our thinking by reminding us of His truth and His past faithfulness to us in other situations.

Even when we might not always understand all that God is doing through our trials, we can stand fast and rely on what He has revealed. The testing of our faith produces endurance and spiritual maturity, and it supplies what we lack. Knowing this, we can trust the Lord to accomplish His good and perfect will through any situation, and rejoice in how He will transform us.

A WORD FROM PASTOR ROB

Hello Church family! I give thanks to God for our relationship and for Southern Hills Christian Church. In all things, let us begin with a sense of gratitude. As we give thanks to what we see, experience and understand, our eyes will be opened to the many other blessings which are a part of our lives. You've probably noticed that some of the times, I write theologically reflective pieces in this space. Often the content of my theological reflections are me floating a trial balloon, of sorts (this is a better venue to do that, than say... the pulpit!). At other times I have written poetic prayers or tried to be creative in other ways. Writing on a regular basis takes time and thought, because I do not want to waste your time anymore than mine. It's not something I take lightly, our time is precious, and I want whatever I write to be reflective of that fact. Please feel free to share insights, questions or feedback you may have! I'd be more than happy to do so over a cup of coffee or tea, just give me a call!

The past two weeks I served the church as a leader of the Bethany Fellowship, returned to preach, and then spent the better part of a week with about 1500 other ministers in Minneapolis listening to some of the nation's best preachers do what they do at the Festival of Homiletics. Blessings abound! Both of these trips were intense, each in their own way. At the first, I did a lot of listening, and I mean A LOT! It's such a gift to sit with recently ordained clergy and hear them share from the depths of their authentic selves. I shared a bit about this in church during the sermon on May 12th, when we reflected on the many names of God, and the beauty of God's diverse creation.

My mom was in worship with us that morning, so I was especially nervous to preach a sermon that challenged all of us to be mindful of the privileges we assume based on aspects of our identity (i.e. being cis gender). Conversations of

this nature are not new around here but to many, including my mother, it was a new concept to discuss such issues in terms of faith. For most of us such conversations are difficult as we try to be intentional about good listening and thoughtful regarding how we respond. SHCC is ahead of the curve as it comes to talking about difficult issues and how they affect our faith, or how our faith impacts our conversations about issues of identity. This is not easy work, but what in life worth having comes easy? Thanks be to God for this place where Love is the order of the day (every day).

The week spent in Minneapolis was fruitful in its own way as well. Averaging 5 sermons or lectures a day for the better part of the work week, added up to so Many WORDS! I continue to process what Rev. William Barber, Brian McClaren, Rev. Traci Blackmon, Pastor Will Willimon and so many others shared. I look forward to sharing with you some of the highlights from the pulpit. The quote that stood out the most, was from Rev. Blackmon quoting another scholar with these words, "Justice is what love looks like out loud."

Returning home after the Festival of Homiletics, it was a true joy Sunday morning to be led in worship by our youth. They demonstrated for us what it is that God asks of each of us: that we offer our sincerest, most authentic selves in prayer and in worship. The feeling conveyed in worship was spot on; from beginning to end. I pray that each of us would, from their example, remember our call to serve our church and our world with our God given voices. Some of the times that may be challenging; but the things in life worth having, require work. May we continue to be blessed with the overflowing joy we know and experience in relationship with each other, our communities, and our God.
