A WORD FROM PASTOR ROB

What a blessing it is to be a part of the community at SHCC. I hope that you were able to be a part of the VBS experience last week! Our theme was Renew. Beyond touching the lives of the children, youth and adults that were a part of this ministry, we tried to live more deeply into our identity as a Green Chalice church. You will be hearing more about that in time. Suffice it to say, we are trying to double down on our recycling efforts, including the possibility of beginning to compost church wide; again, stayed tuned for more details. Thank you to Rev. Combs for her superior leadership and to the countless volunteers who were present before, after and during VBS. Mr. Curtis and the CDC team were incredibly helpful as well, going above and beyond in terms of team work and flexibility. Truly we are blessed to be in community here!

In the weeks ahead, as the summer draws to a close, there will be a 6-week sermon series in worship titled, "Drinking Deeply from the Psalms." Theologian Rolf Jacobson proposed the idea, based loosely on Walter Brueggemann's "typology that in life we move through a pattern of ups and downs: Orientation: When life is stable and the world seems trustworthy (Psalm 1 -7/28 and Psalm 113 – 8/4), to Disorientation: When the bottom drops out and the tradition feels like a lie (Psalm 69 – 8/11), to Re-Orientation: When faith in a trustworthy God and creation are found again, but the 3expierience of disorientation is not forgotten (Psalm 27 - 8/18,

Psalm 40 - 8/25, and Psalm 146 - 9/1)." If you can, please read the assigned Psalm at least a couple of times before you arrive to worship. As we explore these 6 Psalms we will explore how God journeys with us through different seasons of life. As always, I look forward to your input and feedback.

General Assembly will be winding down by the time you receive this newsletter. I can assure you it was a treat to represent SHCC at G.A.. The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is much more diverse on a national level than we are here in Edmond. However, I think we are ahead of the curve in some ways, particularly for a predominantly white affluent congregation. Our vision states that, "Jesus Christ calls us to be a faith community that nurtures ALL people in spiritually transforming relationships with God, others, and all creation." No doubt, we probed the depth this week as a denomination regarding what "ALL" means. Just as we continue to do that around here. It has been a part of our journey since the inception of our faith, in that way, it is in keeping with who we are. The big question seems to be, "What if "All," includes people I find on the other side of the line from me regarding political, polity, or theological issues, etc.?" It's one thing to say we will nurture "All," it's an entirely different thing to do so. Do you have any idea about how to do so, or if we should? I'd love to hear your thoughts!

AfterTech recycles via re-use and/or remanufacturing and donating or reselling at reduced prices for those less fortunate. If a product is completely unusable, it is broken down and the materials are transferred to appropriate local refineries. AfterTech is also a computer and

technology resource for schools, colleges, vo-techs and many Oklahoma businesses.

Knowing exactly what you want will help us make a choice to recommend to you. We want our recommendation to reflect exactly what you believe SHCC needs in a minister at this time. We greatly appreciate your participation and will be happy to answer any of your questions.

The 20 Ministry Skills are classified into 3 separate categories:

- Outreach/Teaching Ministries
- Pastoral/Worship Ministries
- Membership Development/Administrative.

On Sunday, August 11, you will be asked to choose the top three skills for each section that you believe are most important for the senior minister at Southern Hills Christian Church.

Outreach/Teaching Ministries

- 1. Interfaith Activities Pastor participates actively in ecumenical relationships and activities; encourages the congregation to do likewise; and encourages a united Christian community witness.
- 2. Educational Program Pastor identifies the educational needs of persons and develops programs to meet those needs; helps to set educational goals for the congregation; works with youth, children and adults.
- 3. Evangelism Pastor emphasizes bringing new members into the congregation regularly; helps to develop commitment to evangelism in other people.
- 4. Involvement in Mission Beyond the Local Community Pastor understands and interprets the mission of the church from a global perspective and encourages support of Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) outreach.
- 5. Mission in the Local Community Pastor helps persons understand and act upon social and justice issues; becomes informed and involved in the community; and, organizes persons for community action.
- 6. Responsibilities and Relationships with the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), both Regional & General Pastor is involved in the life of the church beyond the congregation; has a strong personal commitment to the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and helps the congregation to know and be involved in the work of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
- 7. Teaching Pastor has a strong commitment to the teaching ministry; interprets and teaches the Scriptures, theological concepts, church history, etc; provides instruction for church leaders, members, etc.

SEARCH COMMITTEE - CONTINUED

Pastoral & Worship Ministries

- 1. Congregational Home Visitation Pastor makes pastoral calls on people in their homes.
- 2. Corporate Worship Pastor plans and leads worship; works with the congregation to develop a rich life of devotion and praise.
- 3. Counseling Pastor maintains confidentiality; is compassionate and sensitive to other's needs; helps persons develop emotional maturity; knows when to refer.
- 4. Hospital and Emergency Visitation Pastor makes pastoral calls on persons in hospitals and nursing homes; ministers to persons in crisis situations.
- 5. Proclamation of the Word Pastor is an effective preacher; can articulate personal faith; illumines, inspires and motivates persons to be active Christians in the world.
- 6. Spiritual Development of Members Pastor models life of prayer and study; helps persons develop their spiritual life; encourages persons to relate their faith to their daily lives.

Membership Development/Administrative Ministries

- 1. Administrative Leadership Pastor accepts responsibility for administrative leadership; encourages shared leadership; helps others to develop leadership abilities; encourages others to assume leadership roles.
- 2. Congregational Communication Pastor encourages two-way communication in the congregation; shares information, and encourages shared problem-solving.
- 3. Evaluation of Program & Staff Pastor plans and implements evaluation of programs; establishes procedures to evaluate staff performance in accord with goals and objectives.
- 4. Minister's Personal Creativity and Resourcefulness Pastor plans and leads program activities; is imaginative and innovative; utilizes fresh and stimulating resources.
- 5. Planning Congregational Life Pastor understands long-range planning and goal setting; helps leaders work together; works with committees/ officers; works effectively on a team.
- 6. Stewardship & Commitment Program Pastor is committed to stewardship education; encourages regular stewardship growth; challenges the congregation to commitment to the church's work.
- 7. Congregational Fellowship Pastor builds a sense of fellowship and community; reaches out to inactive members; accepts persons with divergent background and traditions.
