ONE SERVICE AND PUMPKIN UNLOADING - 9/29

Please make plans to attend on Sunday, September, 29, 2018 for a single service of worship. It is Teamwork Sunday, and lots of great things are happening!

Sunday School meets at 9:30 am, followed by a single service of worship at 10:45 led by our Stephen Ministers. Immediately following the service, there

will be a brief Quarterly Congregational Meeting.

After the meeting, pumpkin unloading begins, as we officially kick off the 23rd annual Pumpkin Parish! Please stick around to help unload. Pizza and bottled water will be available. Dress casually, and don't forget your work gloves!

FIRST YEAR REPORT ON THE WEEKEND BREAKFAST

Last September 1, we had the first free breakfast. As of this week we have served 927 visitors a hot meal and sent home enough food for the day.

I am frequently asked what this project costs. In the last six months, I have spent \$2122.61 for food and kitchen supplies. We have had 455 people come in to eat in this same time period. Kitchen supplies are small items such as paper sacks, zip lock bags, table cloths and utensils. This money comes from fundraisers, donations and a percentage designated from outreach committee funds.

Recent kitchen improvements include a new microwave oven, commercial freezer and refrigerator. These were made possible by a grant from the Oklahoma Disciples Foundation and some very generous donors.

Next we are looking at replacing our 27 year old dishwashers with one new under counter commercial dishwasher. Our present dishwashers take nearly 3 hours to complete a cycle. Older dishwashers do not produce enough heat to sanitize the dishes. The new one will complete more than 20 cycles per hour. Most importantly it will sanitize the dishes with 180 degree water and protect everyone who uses the dishes from illness such as hepatitis. Hand washing the dishes does not do this unless you rinse with bleach. One drawback is that they are expensive, almost \$5,000. A grant proposal is being completed at this

time to help with the purchase.

I would like to expand the breakfast to include Sundays in January. I think we will do most of the prep work for both meals on Friday. Yes, I will be looking for more volunteers. Volunteers still make all the difference at the weekend breakfast. They make it happen. I can't say thank you enough. They not only fix the food and clean up, but they are also building positive relationships with our visitors. As one visitor said on a recent survey, "everyone is friendly" and "nobody judges". If you would like to help in some way, please give me a call. We need volunteers for all areas of the breakfast plus the planning committee.


WOMEN'S MINISTRIES


The event theme is "ROSES Everywhere: Empowering Women for God's Call". There will be opportunities for fellowship, learning and worshiping together.
