

Join us for the inaugural Edmond Pride ecumenical worship service at Southern Hills Christian Church on Friday, October 11th at 6:30pm. On the eve of the 2nd annual Edmond Pride, Rev. Jay Williams and other metro area clergy and local church leaders who are supportive of the LGBTQIA+ community, will gather to lead a celebration of the Edmond Pride 2019 theme: "Live. Love. Be." This worship experience will be inclusive of all people, while drawing from the experiences of differing Christian traditions. Elements of the service will include singing, liturgy, and prayer. This will be a family friendly service with our "pray-ground" in the sanctuary, as well as child care in the nursery. All people of faith or no faith are invited.

The worship service itself should last about an hour, and then immediately following will be a reception in the pumpkin patch!

HAVE YOU NOTICED LATELY?

When God sent His Son to earth He did not intend for Him to be a superstar. Jesus came to serve. Since we are His disciples, we are to follow His wonderful example and serve this lost and hurting world. Do you remember the story about Zaccheus the tax collector? Although he was very rich he was hated and rejected because he was a tax collector. He realized there was something missing in his life. He had heard about this man named Jesus so because he was so small in stature he climbed up in a tree. As Jesus passed this man in the tree, He recognized his need. In or life there are many people like Zaccheus ---- needy, empty, lonely and searching for hope. But, too often we are so preoccupied with our own activities that we don't even notice them.
