MATS FOR THE HOMELESS - TWO YEAR REPORT

Making sleeping mats for the homeless is a service project at Southern Hills Church, started in November 2017. We repurpose plastic shopping bags, creating mats that offer protection from the elements for our homeless friends. Plastic yarn (called PLARN) is made by cutting and joining strips, and then crocheting 6'x 3' mats.

Here are some (approximate) statistics on the project – since November 2017:

Delivered 59 mats for Refuge Fellowship (Church in downtown OKC)

- Collected and processed between 35,000 and 36,000 plastic bags
- Held over 160 workshops to sort, cut, and joint strips to produce the PLARN
- People spent an estimated 2,500-3,000 hours of service
- Dozens of people (ages 7-101) worked on the project
- Many prayers were offered, and personal notes were written, for our homeless friends.


At right, four mats on the altar of Refuge Fellowship, dedicated to the homeless persons in need of them.

If you want to join the project, here are things to know:

You can donate clean, used, plastic bags at any time (bring to the church).

- You can volunteer to work on your own at home, or join a workshop at any time.
- Workshops are held at SHCC on Mondays at 6:00 pm and Tuesdays at 10:30 am most weeks.
- No special skills are needed, just willingness to spend some time and use your hands. (We need sorters, cutters, joiners to process the donated bags and make the PLARN.)
- For people wanting to crochet, a workshop will be held soon. (Not everyone crochets.)
- Anyone is welcome to participate at any time.
